The Oahu District Sangha Day on April 27, Saturday, was an inspiration! It started with a beautiful service at the Waianae Hongwanji temple. It brought back memories of my youth when I visited Waianae for Bon Dances. The decision to close the temple was made earlier and there was a sense of loss as another temple was closing due to lack of support.



The inspiration came from visiting the Mouna (Sanskrit for "inner silence") Farm Arts & Cultural Center. In the past 15 years through a vision of a handful of people, it developed beyond just farming, into an Arts and Cultural Village. It has become a tourist attraction where people from all over the world come to experience meditation, a peace garden, a Bodhi Tree, ceramics and art, and Brother Sooriya, a designated "Living Treasure of Hawaii," who works with copper sculptures. It was amazing how so much was developed "from the Waianae jungle."

We returned on our Waikiki Trolley for lunch. We then had a fascinating presentation by Chikako Nago, from EM (Effective Microorganisms) Hawaii LLC. Her company is dedicated to changing the balance of microorganisms to help the environment and enhance our own "gut" health. They developed the Genki Ball project to clean up the Ala Wai Canal...and it's working!!

On May 5th, Children's Day, Sensei led everyone to make beautiful origami flowers! On May 12th, we celebrated Mother's Day. Carolyn Uchiyama was the guest speaker. She brought back touching memories reading from our 2008 Mother's Day booklet...wonderful memories of writing about their mothers and the sacrifices they made to improve our lives. Each person in attendance received a red long-stemmed rose. Both events were very well received!
